All juniors in HONORS English must read the following title:

Little Fires Everywhere by Celeste Ng

At the beginning of the school year, all HONORS level students will use the assigned reading to answer four multiple-choice questions and write an open response on a given prompt. The writing prompt will NOT be given ahead of time. No books, notes, or draft work will be permitted during the writing session. The Open Response will be graded using the Open Response Rubric (attached).

In addition, Honors level students **may be given additional assignments** and assessments (in class) based on this completed reading as well as the literary terms listed below.

NOTE: Only Honors students have summer reading and they will read ONLY the one book.

ALL STUDENTS must also be familiar with the lists of literary terms below.
